~A THOUGHT FROM JOE

~A SHOPPING FAST – *Beth Fogg*

Have you ever participated in a fast? Many Christians today find it helpful to follow the Biblical discipline of periodic prayer and fasting as they seek to know and follow the will of God.

Have you ever chosen to fast from shopping? A growing number of Christians are participating in an attempt to purchase only food, medicine and hygiene items for a specified period of time, such as three or six months.

There are a number of potential benefits to such a discipline. For some, it is a way to simplify their lives and contribute to a more sustainable lifestyle. For others, it is a way to get out of debt. Still others are trying to be a better role model to their children. A few are using the money saved in this practice to donate more to Kingdom causes that are important to them.

Whatever their motivations, participants report a growing realization of how few things they actually need to live happy, productive lives.

The purpose of the survey is to explore the individual and collective experiences (struggles, victories, insights, stories) of female Baptist pastors. Their hope is to analyze the survey findings and include them in a book designed to challenge Baptist clergy, laity and denominational leaders to increase dialogue and develop strategies to help female clergy to break through the proverbial "glass ceiling."
