Pastor Michele Humphrey is the pastor of Imani United Church of Christ located in Euclid, Ohio. In just four years, God has expanded the ministry of Imani Church which has resulted in the need of adding a 3rd Sunday morning Service and plans for future expansion to house the growing congregation! Pastor Humphrey is known for ministering on tough topics such as domestic violence, sexual perversion, abusive power in leadership, and empowering messages that challenge the listener to move beyond mediocrity and complacency. Pastor Humphrey is the founder of the L.E.A.H. (love, encouragement, acceptance, hope) Ministry which is a ministry geared to developing the whole woman. Pastor Humphrey has served as the Director of the Imani Scholars Preschool and Daycare Center and is a founding member of the Women Clergy Association of Greater Cleveland. Her ministry also included Destiny Radio, a radio ministry of healing and empowerment.

Pastor Humphrey earned a Master of Arts degree in 2005 from Ashland Theological Seminary in Christian Ministry and a Diploma of Theology in Black Church Studies in 2001 from the McCreary Center for African American Religious Studies. Pastor Humphrey is married to Deacon Sylvester Humphrey. She is the proud mother of two adult children, Ashley and Alayna, and is the proud grandmother of Amara Lynn.

The Reverend Dr. Wilma R. Johnson, Senior Pastor, New Prospect Missionary Baptist Church, Detroit, MI



The Reverend Dr. Wilma Robena Johnson is an ordained Baptist minister and woman of God. On March 1, 1999, she became the Senior Pastor of New Prospect Missionary Baptist Church in Detroit, MI. Her ministry journey began in September of 1974. She was licensed by the Rev. Russell Fox, Sr., Mt. Olive Baptist Church in East Orange, New Jersey and the late Dr. E. A. Freeman at First Baptist Church in Kansas City, Kansas. In 1992, she was ordained by Rev. Dr. Charles Gilchrist Adams for full time ministry. She joyfully served Hartford Memorial Baptist Church, Detroit, MI., as the Assistant to the Pastor in Christian Nurture for almost nine years. For thirty three years, Dr. Johnson has continued to teach, conduct workshops and preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Dr. Johnson and her husband, Deacon David L. Johnson, have two sons, David Lawrence, 23 and Brian Langston, 19 years of age. She enjoys reading, singing and bowling.

Dr. Johnson has a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Administration, a Masters of Arts Degree in Pastoral Ministry and a Doctor of Ministry Degree from the Ecumenical Theological Seminary in Detroit, Michigan. The Reverend Dr. Stephanie Allen is an Associate Pastor and has worked at First Baptist Church of Greater Cleveland since 1998. Currently she works with small groups, fellowship groups, visitation, worship planning, preaching and teaching, Stephen Ministry, covenant groups and congregational care. She has served as the Minister of Youth, Young Adults and Single-minded ministries, Director of Fellowship Groups, Minister of Congregational Care, the Wedding Coordinator and leader for numerous small groups at First Baptist.

She is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, receiving a BA in English and a minor in African-American literature in 1997. Stephanie received her Masters of Divinity degree at Ashland Theological Seminary in 2003 and was ordained in January 2004. Stephanie completed her Doctor of Ministry degree in the field of Biblical Hebrew language and pedagogy and the traditions of Ancient Israel and their practical application to ministry. She co-teaches every other year Biblical Hebrew for Ashland Theological Seminary.

She is married to Mitch, who helps with the youth through teaching Sunday School, plays bells in the Bell choir and is an active participant in the community theater at FBC. Together they have four children: Marin, Caden, Cohen and Soren.

The Reverend Christine A. Smith, Senior Pastor, Covenant Baptist Church, Wickliffe, Ohio; Facilitator, WTIM



A native of Akron, Ohio, the **Reverend Christine A. Smith** accepted Jesus Christ as her personal savior at the age of fifteen. She answered a call to the Gospel Ministry and was licensed to preach in the Tabernacle Baptist Church of Akron, Ohio at age 17. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Education Degree, specializing in Learning Disabilities and Developmental Handicaps (1987) from the University of Akron. She holds a Masters of Divinity from the Interdenominational Theological Center, Morehouse School of Religion in Atlanta, Georgia, specializing in Systematic Theology and Women's Studies (1990). In 1993 Rev. Smith joined the Olivet Institutional Baptist Church in Cleveland, Ohio under the pastorate of the Reverend Dr. Otis Moss, Jr., and was ordained to the Gospel Ministry in 1995. She served Olivet as Minister of Christian Education for three years. Rev. Smith was featured in the *African American Pulpit* as one of the "Twenty to Watch" (Winter 2001-2002 issue, Judson Press).

In January 2006, Rev. Smith became the pastor of the Covenant Baptist Church, Wickliffe, Ohio. She holds the distinction of becoming the first female Pastor of Covenant, the first African-American Pastor of Covenant and the second female Baptist pastor in the Greater Cleveland Area (of a mainline denomination - American Baptist). She currently serves as President of the Board of Trustees of the Cleveland Baptist Association. In 2009, Rev. Smith wrote and successfully secured a grant from the National Minister's Council (ABC/USA) to begin, "**Women Together in Ministry of Greater Cleveland.**" *WTIM* is a network designed to connect, encourage and support women in ministry. She also produces a weekly blog, "*Shepastor*," (<http://shepastor.blogspot.com>) a site dedicated to providing encouragement, guidance, words of wisdom and instruction to female clergy. Rev. Smith is the proud wife of Aristide Smith, Jr., and mother of three children: two wonderful boys - Aristide III and Caleb and a beautiful daughter, Aris Christine. Truly, God has been good to the Reverend Christine A. Smith. For His loving kindness and tender mercies, she simply says, "To God be the glory for the things He has done!"

The Reverend Marilyn P. Turner, Associate Executive Director of American Baptist Home Mission Societies, Center for Missional Life and Leadership



The Reverend Marilyn Patricia Turner was born in Rochester, Pa., the youngest daughter of the late Rev. Walter L. Turner and Julia M. Turner. She relocated to the Philadelphia area as a corporate consultant, working with Bell Atlantic and other businesses, before answering God’s call to full-time ministry. Rev. The Reverend Dr. Marvin A. McMickle, Senior Pastor, Antioch Baptist Church, Cleveland, Ohio



Born in Chicago, Illinois, **Dr. Marvin A. McMickle** is a 1970 graduate of Aurora University in Illinois with a B.A. in Philosophy. His alma mater also awarded him the degree of Doctor of Divinity in 1990. He earned a Master of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary in New York City in 1973 and did two additional years of graduate study at Columbia University in New York. He earned a Doctor of Ministry degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, New Jersey in 1983. He was awarded the Doctor of Philosophy degree (Ph.D.) from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio in 1998. He was ordained to the Christian ministry in 1973 at Abyssinian Baptist Church of New York City where he served on the pastoral staff from 1972-1976. He served as the pastor of St. Paul Baptist Church of Montclair, New Jersey from 1976-1986.

Dr. McMickle has served as the Senior Pastor of Antioch Baptist Church in Cleveland, Ohio since 1987. During that time he led the church in establishing a ministry for people infected with or affected by HIV/AIDS. This ministry was the first of its kind in the entire country. Dr. McMickle is the Professor of Homiletics at Ashland Theological Seminary in Ashland, Ohio where he has served on the full-time faculty since 1996. He is the author of numerous books, his most recent being, *Deacons in Today's Black Baptist Church*, (Judson Press, 2010). He has also authored dozens of articles that regularly appear in professional journals and magazines. He is a member of the Martin Luther King, Jr. International Board of Preachers at Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA. In the winter semester of 2009 he served as a Visiting Professor of Preaching at Yale University Divinity School. Dr. McMickle has been married to Peggy Lorraine Noble since 1975 and they have one son, Aaron.

The Reverend Patricia Hernandez, Consultant for Leadership Development, American Baptist Churches of Michigan



The Reverend Patricia Hernandez was born in Geneva, Switzerland and spent the first two years of her life in Yugoslavia, before her parents, who were missionaries at the time, returned to the United States. Growing up in some of the depressed urban neighborhoods of Dearborn, Detroit and Philadelphia, she developed a deep affinity for and sensitivity towards those who live on the margins of mainstream society. Out of this concern emerged her call to ministry. After graduating from the University of Chicago, Rev. Hernandez attended Colgate Rochester Divinity school where she received her MDiv degree. With a passion for the spiritual life, she has participated in programs at Shalem Institute for Spiritual Formation and Oasis Ministries/Lancaster Theological Seminary receiving certificates in Spiritual Direction and Group Spiritual Direction and also completed the Foundations for Christian Leadership program at Duke Divinity School.

Rev. Hernandez served as a pastor in New York and Pennsylvania as well as in a ministry to migrant farmworkers before being called to her current position as Consultant for Leadership Development with the American Baptist Churches of Michigan. Anchoring her ministry in the Great Commandment and Great Commission, she describes her mission as “loving God, loving others, and leading people to Christ.” “Most important”, she says, “in all that I do, I hope to be a Christ-bearer, a witness to the Good news, so that by my example, others will know Christ and be called to live accordingly. My ministry is not separate from my life. For me, being a minister is not my job...it’s my life!”

The Reverend Dr. Valentino Lassiter, Senior Pastor, East View United Church of Christ, Shaker Heights, Ohio



Dr. Valentino Lassiter is a native of Suffolk, Virginia. He attended elementary and high school in that city. He felt the call to preach the gospel while he was a youngster. Dr. Lassiter attended Fisk University and graduated in 1984 with a B.A. degree with a double major in sociology and religion. He earned a Master of Divinity degree from Boston University in 1977. Dr. Lassiter came to Cleveland, Ohio in 1979 when he was selected to serve as Pastor of the East View United Church of Christ in Shaker Heights, Ohio. He began teaching part-time at Cleveland State University in the Department of Religious Studies in 1984 and continued in that capacity until 1988. In 1989, he was hired by John Carroll University in Cleveland Heights, Ohio to teach in the Department of Religious Studies at the rank of assistant professor. In 1993 he was selected to serve as *Pastor in Residence and Lecturer in Religious Studies*. He currently holds that position.

Dr. Lassiter has taught such courses as *Religion in Black Culture, Roots of the Black Family, African Religion Survey, The African-American Church, Theology of African-American Sacred Music, Introduction to Religion, Current Moral Issues*, as well as *Life, Times and Theology of Martin Luther King*. Dr. Lassiter studied on a part-time basis through seminars at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri. He was awarded his Doctor of Ministry degree from that institution in 1995. He is the author of the book, *Martin Luther King In the African-American Preaching Experience*. He serves on several boards and committees and is active in several Christian organizations. Rev. Dr. Lassiter is married to the former Yvonne Gillum. They have three children. He is a scholar, dynamic preacher, teacher, family man and a dedicated servant of the Lord.

The Reverend Yvonne B. Carter, American Baptist Home Mission Societies, Managing Director, Event Development



The Reverend Yvonne B. Carter was born in Youngstown, Ohio, into a family of Baptist preachers and deacons. She confessed Christ and was baptized as a teenager. Early in life, she knew there was something God wanted her to do, but it was not until many years later that she understood and answered her call to the Gospel ministry. After graduating from Youngstown State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration, she embarked upon a 20-year career in marketing and management with the Bell System, moving from Youngstown to Cleveland during that time. Following her early retirement from Bell, she entered a 10-year career in fund-raising and management with United Way Services. During those years, she accepted and acknowledged her call to ministry, and enrolled in seminary. Yvonne was licensed to ministry in 1995 by Grace Tabernacle Baptist Church, where she has served as the Assistant to the Pastor; Director of Evangelism and Discipleship; and where she continues to serve as an associate minister.

After retiring from United Way, Yvonne accepted a position with the Cleveland Baptist Association (CBA) to direct the youth at risk program known as the Youth Empowerment Project. Upon graduation from Ashland Theological Seminary in 1998, she was ordained as an American Baptist minister. In 2001 she joined the national staff of ABCUSA, where she ministered in several capacities, including Director of Black Church Education. She currently serves as the Managing Director of Event Development for the American Baptist Home Mission Societies' Center for Missional Life and Leadership (ML&L). In addition to these responsibilities she provides oversight and supervision to seven ML&L executive staff members who serve as the National Coordinators for Asian and Hispanic ministries; Chaplaincy and Pastoral Counseling; Intercultural Strategies; Prisoner Re-entry and Aftercare; and the American Baptist Personnel System. Yvonne is a proud mother and the grandmother of five children to whom she refers as her "grand-blessings."

The Reverend Courtney Clayton Jenkins currently serves as the Pastor of Euclid Avenue Congregational Church, United Church of Christ. She was born and raised in Cleveland Ohio and is a 2004 graduate of Spelman College where she received a Bachelor of Arts in English Literature. In 2008, Rev. Jenkins received her Masters of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary with a concentration in Preaching and Congregational Ministry. In the United Church of Christ denomination, Rev. Jenkins is an ordained minister and serves in several capacities. She previously served as the Designated Pastor of Shaker Heights Community Church, United Church of Christ. Rev. The Reverend Kesha Boyce Williams, Journalist, Associate Minister, Olivet Institutional Baptist Church, Cleveland, Ohio

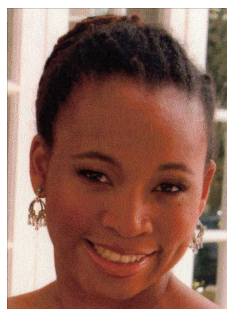
